Photography Exhibition: InsideOut – Singapore through the Eyes of Migrants



SINGAPORE, 11 Aug 2011 – *Migrant Voices* and *Objectifs* – *Centre for Filmmaking and Photography* announced that the fourth installment of the Inside Out Photography Exhibition will be held at lifestyle cafe *A Curious Teepee* from 9 to 25 September 2011.

InsideOut is a photography project that seeks to empower low-wage migrant workers with basic photography skills and provide them an avenue to express themselves. The project also presents a unique opportunity to engage Singaporeans and facilitate reflection and conversations on the inter-cultural aspects of identity, integration and social spaces.

The volunteer-run initiative was inaugurated in 2005 and featured during the Month of Photography in 2009 and 2010. This year, 17 migrant workers, including residents of shelters run by the Humanitarian Organisation for Migrant Economics (HOME), participated in intensive workshop sessions on Sundays for 10 weeks. Participants used their personal cameras or cameras donated by the public to explore colors, compositions and using photography as a storytelling medium.

Migrant workers, excluding HOME shelter residents, paid a nominal fee to participate in the workshops conducted by professional photographers Sam Chin, Lim Yaohui, Deanna Ng and Chia Yan Wei. Some were attracted to the project to develop their personal skills. Said Tiktik Rostika, an Indonesian domestic worker who has worked in Singapore for more than 2 years, "Every week, I look forward to participating in the workshops on my off day. In future, I would like to return to

my hometown in Bandung. As I continue to develop these skills, I may be able to find a job in a photo studio back home."

Participation in the project has also broadened the perspectives of the photographer mentors. Said documentary photographer Deanna Ng, "It is refreshing to see the photographs taken by the migrants, based on their personal experiences, perspectives and imagination. They reminded me that a good picture is taken not because you have the best camera, but because you have a willingness to learn and something to say".
